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MACKAY & DISTRICT 4WD CLUB Inc. ASSOCIATION BY-LAWS (05-05-04)

ACTIVITIES

 (a) The Trip Leader should remind all drivers before moving off, that convoy procedure should be followed. Participants on trips will obey the Trip Leader's instructions at all times regarding speed, position in convoy, convoy procedure and route to be taken on or off roads and tracks. The Trip Leader's instructions will not be deviated from except in the case of discussion by all members on the trip and a majority vote on the proposed deviation by those members pre-

Prior to the start of a trip, the Leader must:

- Arrange suitable rendezvous during the trip at which all vehicles stop. These are based on either time or distance.
- ii. Inform the driver of the last vehicle that he/she is the last vehicle in the convoy.
- Check with drivers of vehicles that all basic essential equipment is carried in or on each vehicle. Refer Clauses 4 and 5.
- iv. Check with drivers that any specially requested equipment is carried in or on vehicles.
- (b) The lead vehicle will stop at any turn-off or intersection at which doubt may exist as to the correct direction. It will wait for the following vehicle before moving off in the correct direction. Each successive vehicle will then wait for the following vehicle before moving off. By this means, all will follow the lead vehicle and a message can also be sent in both directions along the convoy. At other times it is the responsibility of any preceding vehicle to keep the vehicle following in sight.
- (c) No vehicle in convoy will pass another vehicle in convoy without the Trip Leader's instructions, unless under exceptional circumstances, whilst the convoy is moving.
- (d) When travelling in convoy on main roads, the distance between any vehicle should not be less than six (6) vehicle lengths, to assist overtaking traffic.
- (e) Avoid driving too close to the vehicle in front on bush tracks, where ratio changing and braking could be a problem.
- (f) Persons leaving Association convoy or group MUST notify the trip leader and if possible, give details of their intentions.
- No unofficial competitions or displays of "Four wheel driving" shall take place during Association trips without permission of Property Owner and/or Trip Leader. [Refer Clause 1 (a) paragraph 3].
- 3) Vehicles must be registered, maintained and in a good road-worthy condition. The Association reserves the right to demand a Safety Certificate from an authorized Inspection Station designated by the Association, at the Member's expense. All drivers shall hold a current Drivers License.
- Every 4WD vehicle on Association trips and/or 4WD activity must be fitted with front and rear towing points.
- 5) Every 4WD vehicle must carry basic recovery gear and First Aid Kit on Association activities.
- Permission must be obtained from property owners before travelling on their property. Permits required MUST BE OBTAINED for Forestry and National Parks.

- 7) No animals will be brought on Association trips.
- 8) Fuel tanks must be filled prior to the departure time of the trip.
- 9) Fire-arms prohibited on all Association trips and activities.
- At Association functions, members are expected to follow verbal instructions and visual signs erected by the organizers. Association members are responsible for their visitors.
- 11) (a) Bushfire regulations shall be obeyed at all times.
 - (b) Camp and billy fires must be totally extinguished by water, and/or covered with earth.
- 12) Before breaking camp members will clear the site of all litter and rubbish deposited during their stay, and carry it with them away from the camp area to a designated rubbish dump or receptacle.
- 13) When crossing private property and crown land under lease, gates, clip-rails and property will be left as found, or as instructed by the Trip Leader. Where gates are to be opened/closed, the first vehicle behind the Trip Leader will pull over and open the gate and after the convoy passes this vehicle will close same and fall into convoy in front of Tail End Charlie. This rotation procedure will be repeated for each gate open/closure.
- 14) No member of the Association will at any time knowingly give information of any kind to any person, who is not a member of the Association, which may assist that person to gain access to areas which the Association visits on Association activities where those areas are "off the beaten track", or not general knowledge.
- 15) The wearing of **seatbelts** is mandatory. Riding on vehicle bonnets and tailgates is prohibited.
- (a) Fauna will not be disturbed. Fishing excepted where permitted.
 - (b) Flora of any description is not to be removed under any circumstances whilst on Association activities.
- 17) Motorcycles to be excluded from attending Association outings and field days. Property owner has discretionary powers
- 18) No person shall exceed the legal alcohol limit when driving in any Association activity. Nor shall any person consume such alcohol while driving in any Association activity.
- 19) Tracks and roads should not be deviated from. This is particularly relevant where Parthenium, Giant Rats Tail or other noxious weed is present. Where required by property owner, appropriate vehicle washdown shall take place. Any damage caused to tracks and roads will be repaired where required and/or where practicable.
- 20) It is mandatory for members of M&D4WDC, if when visiting or traversing official club properties to pursue 4WD activity and on other than a current M&D4WDC event, to register their name and the date in the Activities Book.

ADMINISTRATION

- Any elected Association Member is disallowed from holding the same Official Committee Member position, after having served three consecutive terms of office in that same role.
- The appointed <u>Committee Member</u> term extends to 6 months overall, with the <u>Assistant Committee Member</u> whose term of 3 months is included in the 6 months term assumes voting rights after 3 months when the <u>Committee Member</u> retires and the new <u>Assistant</u> is appointed.

DRIVING IN THE OUTBACK - www.tmr.qld.gov.au

Some tips from the Department of Transport for driving in the outback:

Before you leave:

- Work out where you want to go with a good map. Calculate how long it will take driving there.
- Determine all the stops along the way. Driving too far without a break will increase your chances of crashing. You should take at least a 15 minute break every two hours.
- Have your vehicle serviced before your journey.

Just before you leave:

- Check tyres, lights, windscreen wipers, battery, coolant and hoses, oil and fuel.
- Get plenty of sleep the night before no alcohol.
- If you're heading into a remote area, give friends, neighbours or the police the details of your trip.
- Charge your mobile phone. It should work in regional centres but possibly not in areas between.
- Pack plenty of toys and games if you're taking children.
- Obtain a weather report. (Consider delaying your trip if heavy rain is forecast.)
- Check road conditions Transport and Main Roads' website, RACQ, shire councils and local police.

Standard equipment for your outback trip

Pack into your vehicle:

- first aid kit
- water (20 litres emergency use and 4 litres per person per day)
- food, in case of delays or breakdown
- fire extinguisher
- tool kit (jack, winder, wheel brace, spanners, screwdrivers, spare fan belt, hoses and fuses)
- two spare wheels
- tow rope
- shovel (in case you get bogged)
- toilet paper
- maps
- compass or global positioning system (GPS)
- tarpaulin
- cooler or fridge
- rubbish bags
- matches or lighter
- communication equipment. Your mobile phone may not work in the outback.

Unsealed roads

Slow down. Dust may be disguising an oncoming vehicle, pot holes, loose gravel and slippery mud patches. Turn on your headlights where visibility is poor. Consider stopping if you can't see the road in front of you.

Sunrise and sunset

Many of Queensland's outback roads have an east–west orientation. When the sun is low in the sky, clear vision is impossible. You could miss oncoming vehicles or hit an animal crossing the road. Avoid driving before 7.00 am and between 4.00 pm and 5.00 pm.







Fatigue

Long distances and stretches of unchanging landscape can make a driver very tired. Stop for a break if you experience:

- sore or heavy eyes
- dim or fuzzy vision
- daydreaming or hallucinations
- tiredness, stiffness or cramps
- aches and pains
- delayed reactions
- wandering across the road.

Prevent tiredness:

- take regular breaks; at least 15 minutes every two hours
- pull into rest areas, tourist spots and driver reviver stops frequently
- don't drink alcohol before and during the trip
- eat properly (not too much or too little)
- check medications with your doctor
- get plenty of sleep before your trip
- don't drive for more than ten hours a day
- wind down the windows every now and then for some fresh air
- share the driving
- plan ahead
- stop as soon as you feel tired or your attention wanders
- don't start your trip too early in the day. Your body isn't used to concentrating before dawn or in the early hours.



If you are a member of a 'caravanning convoy', don't travel too close together. Other road users will become frustrated if they are unable to overtake safely. The law requires caravans and other large vehicles, outside a built-up area, leave at least 60 m between each other. The distance is 200 m in a road train area.

Animals

Don't swerve to avoid an animal on the road. This may cause you to roll your vehicle. Gently brake and slow down. Beep your horn to alert the animal.

If you come across cattle and sheep on the road, stop and be patient. It's all part of the 'outback experience'. The animal might stop in the middle of the road to watch you approach. Just be patient; perhaps beep your horn and the animal will soon move on.

Weather warning

If the roads are wet, be careful of slippery conditions and unstable road edges. Try to keep one wheel on the bitumen, if possible.

When driving in wet weather:

- keep your windscreen and lights clean
- keep headlights on low beam. In foggy conditions, it is easier to see the low beam
- use your air-conditioner or demister to keep the windscreen clear
- slow down
- double your following distance
- after driving through water, drive a short distance slowly, with your foot on the brake pedal. This helps the brakes dry out.

If you come across a closed road, due to flood, do not attempt to enter. You could face a fine or even endanger your life.







If the road is flooded, avoid attempting to cross. Wait until the level drops or use an alternative route. The force of the flood water could sweep your vehicle away.

Incidents, accidents and emergencies Flat tyre

- Park on flat, firm ground.
- Leave manual vehicles in gear.
- Know how to use your jack.
- Tighten wheel nuts alternatively until all are fully tightened.
- Lower the vehicle slowly.
- Check wheel nuts again.

Road accidents

- Stay calm.
- Check for injury.
- Call for assistance, including fire, ambulance, Flying Doctor and police.
- Don't leave your vehicle. Wait for help to arrive.

In case of injury

- Don't move the injured person if it can be avoided.
- Apply first aid.
- Call for assistance, giving full details of location and injuries.
- Wait for help to arrive.

Shattered windscreen

- Look out of the window or door to see where it is safe to pull over.
- Fill demister vents with paper or cloth. This stops glass getting in the vents.
- Remove glass.
- Wind up other windows.
- Drive on slowly.
- If the windscreen is just cracked, it may be safe to drive on. Replace as soon as possible.

Lost or broken down?

- Don't panic.
- Stay with the vehicle and wait for assistance.
- Flag down or phone for help.
- Make sure vehicle is visible.
- Conserve food water and energy.
- If you become mobile again, advise authorities.





Queensland's outback is a diverse landscape. It can be dusty, muddy, flat or flooded. The roads can be empty but they can also carry ten-car-long road trains. You never know what's around the next bend. It's best to be prepared for every situation.
